Early Rovers History




1965 was the first season that The Loftus Rovers Football Club entered into competition. Registration fees ranged from 2/6d to 5/-, and match fees were 2/- for ages up to 14, and 4/- for those over 14. In the early days there was a "Mother's Club" that used to run the canteen, as well as fundraising and generally organising great social activities.

The original clubhouse still exists today, and we now use it as a gearshed. Some members still remember the days before electricity was connected to the old clubhouse. Members of the mothers club were each responsible to make a block of ice for weekend canteen duties. These were supplemented in later years, by blocks of ice obtained from a milk distribution outlet at Kirrawee. The pie-warmer was run on porta-gas.

Foundation

The club was formed in 1964 by Bill Hodges. It was

the 6th Club to affiliate with The Sutherland Football Association. There are 26 today.



Club Colours

Orange, white and

black, believed to be the influence of Dutch members of the community at the time of inauguration.

Home Ground

Loftus Oval, Princes Highway, Loftus. Orchid Oval, Orchid St, Loftus was used for nursery games.

Incorporation

The Club became incorporated on 13th February 1989.

The Mother's club, which was originally known as the "Women's Committee", was an important part of The Club. They used to run the canteen, fund raising, as well as several social events.

Then, as now, the Club served the communities of Loftus and Yarrawarrah, each of which has a primary school. Because there are no high schools in the immediate area, players often drift to other clubs once they reach Year 7 and make new-found school friends.

Due to changing demographics of our area, the Club changed its name on April 6, 1995 to become Loftus-Yarrawarrah Rovers Soccer Club Inc. The name changed again in 2007 to Loftus Yarrawarrah Rovers Football Club.

Today's clubhouse was completed in 1991. The ashes of Steve Quan, a former life member who lived in Ardisia Place, were buried at the edge of the field, near the clubhouse, in November 1990. Steve, was a past president influential in acquiring the new clubhouse, and the burial ceremony was held on its foundations.

Achievements

In 1966 Loftus Rovers was the first Sutherland Association club to win the Robertson Cup (State Cup for Under 21's). Rovers were pioneers for the Shire in State competitions. Although a small club, Rovers have had many successes:

- Winner of Robertson Cup (U21 State): 1966, 1967, 1975 & 2003.
- Winner of Amateur League State Cup: 1980, 1983.
- Runners up Amateur League State Cup: 1984.
- Runners up State Cup (U16): 2008
- Winner of Kanga Cup (U11): 2009
- Winners of W30A Champion of Champions 2014

In fact, Rovers were the first Sutherland Shire Club to win the Robertson Cup & The Amateur League Cup. In 1983 it became the first club in NSW to win the grand slam: State, Admiral & Champion of Champions. This was our most successful season for our senior teams when they won: NSW Amateur Cup, Admiral Cup, 1st & 2nd Grade Competition, Lawrie Dean Trophy, Runners Up of the Frank Tyrrell Trophy & Champion of Champions trophy.

We seemed to be unbeatable in 1983, as Debbie Brown from Loftus became Sutherland Association's 'Miss Soccer', a competition that took place before it was considered sexist!

In 2003 our 21A side emulated the great feat of 1983 by winning the Robertson Cup, the local Premiership and the Champion of Champions trophy.

In 2009 our 11A side became the first Sutherland Shire team to win the KangaCup.

In 2010 our 21A side were semi-finalists in the Robertson Cup.

From the Desk of John Lane Our Club President

This was a season that appeared to go so quickly. I suppose the number of washed out rounds had something to do with that. I do hope all players and their supporters had a fun season. Football is a great team sport and it can be heaps of fun. In this report I will give some of the pertinent facts for the season.



Registrations this year were 523 which were 25 more than the 2014 season. This gave us a total of 44 teams, 21 of which were in competitions.

Of the 21 teams in competition we had the following results in regards to the teams that made the semi finals:

8 made the semis (38%): 15D's, W12B's, W13B's, W18A's, 45B's, W30A's, W30B's, and W30C's.

6 made the finals (28%): 15D's, W12B's, W13B's, 45B's, W30B's, and W30C's.

4 made the grand finals (19%): W13B's, 45B's, W30B's and W30C's.

We won 3 premierships (14%): W13B's W30B's and W30C's.

The W30B's were our only side to become minor premiers.

Huge congratulations to the success of our women's teams: 75% of the teams that made the semis were female teams and this was transferred to the successes in the grand finals where all three teams that became premiers were female teams.

Our under 7 Gala Day celebrated its 14 year. Congratulations to Kath Tanner who stepped up to run the gala day in the absence of Joshua Fsadni who was overseas. Kath is not a committee member but this didn't prevent her from stepping up when she saw the need and did an outstanding job.

Mel Fitzgerald is another person who is not a committee member but stepped up when she saw a need again to replace Joshua Fsadni while he was away. Mel took on the job of organising the Mini Rovers throughout the season and she excelled at this important task.

All functional aspects of our committee worked well this season: Registration, Publicity, Canteen, Treasury, Grounds, Gear, coaching, Social and the management of MiniRoos refs. I know the efforts that the responsible individuals put in and it was nothing short of outstanding. I take this opportunity to thank all committee members for their efforts throughout the year.

I can't thank Coaches and managers enough for their huge contribution. They really are appreciated for their time and effort. And as for all the players, parents and supporters I do hope you experienced a fun season and found out what it is to be a "Rover".

The most disappointing aspect of the season was the number of coaches who reported difficulties in filling their ground control rosters when they were required for duty. It must be said that to be really part of a community, one must contribute to that community. This goes the same for the football community. We only require a couple of hours of people's time two or three times a season. Everyone is expected to contribute in some way.

The committee bestowed "Player Life Member" status on James Diamond and Andrew Kearns from our AL1 side. They have both played 20 years for the club and have both played in five teams that have won premierships. Congratulations to James and Andrew.

The committee has also recommended "Life Membership" status be bestowed on Scott Capps and Robert Blackley. Scott currently plays for our 35E side whilst Robert plays for our 35C side. Both of these players are a couple of club legends. They have both notched up 35 years of service and both also "Player Life Members". To have someone become a "Life Member" there needs to be a vote of the membership as outlined within our constitution. This vote will take place at the AGM on September 13th 2015. I have known both Scott and Robert for 34 years and take pleasure in recommending these two friends to have this honor bestowed upon them.

The Steven Quan trophy, "Club Person of the Year" is awarded to those that have gone the extra mile over a year or two or in fact has steadily contributed to the club over a long period of time. With this in mind the Steve Quan trophy was awarded to two people this season: Greg Quinnell and Darren Currey. Congratulations to them both.

This season the committee saw an opportunity to push for a second field at Loftus Oval while the council is engaging in a land swap with the National Parks for land they own near Bundeena. We have been successful at putting this on the political agenda. We are asking for land that used to be used for sporting activities: pony club and cricket to once again be used this way as a football field. We note within our negotiations that the F6 corridor has been placed back on the political agenda. It may not be well known that the proposed freeway goes straight through Loftus Oval so we would be without a field for our sport. We support those that wish to tunnel beneath the National Park. This would save a huge amount of parkland and we would only need one hectare for an extra field at Loftus. Many see this as an impossible task, but I believe with support from the right quarters it is one we can pull off.

Another major task the committee wishes to explore is expansion of our clubhouse and will pursue our needs in the coming months. I am sure you will hear more on this over the next season.






