## PLAYER PHOTOGRAPHS 2025

### **Mandatory New Photos – (no hats, glasses or headwear)**

- **ALL U10 Boys and Girls and W10 Girls.**
- **ALL NEW players U10/W10 and older.**

Please do the following:

- (1) Take a photo of yourself (player) following the below guidelines.
- (2) Login to your PlayFootball V2.0 account and upload the new photo.
- (3) If you are unable to upload the photo successfully, please send the photo to our club registrar by reply email with your full name and age group.

### **Mandatory Photo Image Guidelines – please ensure:**

- Photo is a passport style image
- Players head faces camera directly with full face in view
- No hats, headwear or glasses are to be worn in the photo
- Photo was taken within the last 12 months
- Photo is clear and legible with appropriate lighting
- Is under 5 MB in size
- Is either .PNG or .JPG file type
- If you require sports glasses, please send a reply email for details of the necessary ID process.



Please Note: any inappropriate photos may result in your registration being declined.

### **SPORTS GLASSES – Approval Requirements NEW PROCESS**

If a player requires sports glasses to enable them to play then their profile photo must display them wearing these approved sports glasses.

All players requiring to wear sports (safety) glasses in all age groups must be approved to wear the glasses by the SSFA Executive Committee (E.C.) before they can be worn in a game.

Players will also need to contact the club registrar in order to provide the detailed documentation that is required for SSFA E.C. approval of sports glasses:

The following documentation is required for EC approval:

- Photo of player wearing the sports glasses e.g. the ID profile image in PlayFootball.
- Photo of the sports glasses including strap (submitted with optometrist's letter).
- Current Letter from optometrist (dated 2024-2025) detailing the type of glasses purchased (with player name) and their specifications, including specific make, material and durability, ensuring that they comply with Football NSW standards. That is, the optometrist, as a minimum, confirms that the glasses "are safe to wear whilst playing football and have a soft [or flexible [depending on the glasses] frame fitted with a plastic or polycarbonate lens and will remain fixed in place by the provided strap"
- Manufacturers specification of the sports glasses.
- Players who wear sports glasses MUST request approval to wear sports glasses EVERY year. If glasses have not changed from when optometrist/specifications were submitted then an email from Club requesting approval is only action required.

For safety reasons, regular prescription glasses are not permitted to be worn.

**Failure to provide a photo that aligns to the above requirements will impact registration being completed.**
